

# Welcome to the Timaru District

From rugged alps across the tapestry of Waitaha/Canterbury Plains to the ocean, South Canterbury is the perfect location for a business event or incentive. Its diverse natural landscape offers sensational opportunities to create memories from fly fishing to white water rafting, scenic flights to Māori rock art.



Timaru, at the heart of the District, was founded in the late 1870s and is renowned for its Edwardian history and architecture, sports and leisure. As a coastal town, it enjoys a sweeping beach at Caroline Bay, home to the blue penguins/kororā and scenic boardwalks that meander the coastline.

Friendly and welcoming, Geraldine is a charming boutique village at the foot of the magnificent Four Peaks Range. It offers a great base to enjoy the thrills and adventure in Peel Forest as well as indulge in some fantastic walks, hikes and gin drinking at its doorstep.

The District has agriculture as its core, and it has become the 'food bowl' of New Zealand. It is home to several large national and international food companies and many fantastic artisan producers. Local cuisine is in abundance, and the economy is thriving.

It is enriched with dynamic businesses, creative, innovative talent and supportive business networks within small towns with big-hearted communities.

## Location

#### **Flying to Timaru**

Home to a national airport, once they're here, everything is on their doorstep, and they're rarely more than a 30-minute drive from all of our venues and activities. Air New Zealand offers daily domestic flights to Timaru from Wellington, with connecting flights from most other regional centres. The scheduled flight time for Wellington to Timaru flights is 80 minutes.

Pick up a car rental to self-drive or sit back and take in the views as a taxi or tour bus collects you.

\*You can fly into Mesopotamia, all planes and helicopters are welcome. The airstrip is a flat grass strip 1km in length with tie-down spots. Gas is available if pre-arranged. The co-ordinates for the airstrip are S 43° 38′ 44″, E 170° 54′ 02″



#### **Driving to Timaru**

If your delegates live in the South Island, Timaru sits centrally located on State Highway 1 on the East Coast of the South Island.

Driving from the north is beautiful, and the scenery is breathtaking as you hug the Southern Alps and Canterbury Plains. With a focus on home-made and hearty, Salmon Tales Café at Rakaia is the perfect place to stop for a coffee and a bite to eat, just look out for the Big Salmon!

Driving times from Christchurch to Timaru:

- Nonstop drive: 102 miles or 164 km
- Driving time: 2 hours, 11 minutes

The journey from the south offers seascapes that are breathtaking and picture worthy, as well as winding you

through our diverse agricultural landscape - driving nonstop would be a challenge!

Stopping off at Riverstone Kitchen is a MUST, an award-winning restaurant nestled in the spectacular North Otago countryside. Riverstone has gained a reputation for delicious food, simply prepared from local, seasonal ingredients.

Driving times from Dunedin to Timaru:

- Nonstop drive: 122 miles or 196 km
- Driving time: 2 hours, 27 minutes

#### 3- day Timaru Base.

You'll take in breathtaking views, including ancient glaciers, towering mountains, high country mountain lakes and braided rivers. You will indulge in a wonderful buffet lunch at the <a href="Hermitage Hotel">Hermitage Hotel</a>, Mount Cook, followed by activities at <a href="The Sir Edmund Hillary Alpine Centre">The Sir Edmund Hillary Alpine Centre</a>. There will be a refreshing walk to the Tasman Glacier and scenic stops at Lake Tekapo -The Church of the Good Shepherd, the <a href="Dark Sky Project">Dark Sky Project</a> lakeside facility and Lake Pukaki.

They can end the day at <u>Humdinger Gin</u> which crafts several international award-winning gins in the heart of Geraldine. They combine traditional methods and equipment with modern thinking, so their gins have quickly gained a cult following. A nice gift is a bottle to take home!

## 2 Day Incentive

The ultimate 2-day Incentive allows for an overnight indulgence in <u>Ngā Whare Mānatu</u> a unique retreat offering luxury accommodation above the beautiful boutique village of Geraldine. Nestled among native plants, stunning birdsong, views to the east coast sunrise and the amazing night sky, their vision is to provide a magical, relaxing experience that showcases the natural environment and everything that connects you to the whenua (land).



#### Day 1

Arrive at Timaru Airport and use <u>Southern Wide Helicopters</u> to fly into Mesopotamia Station. The station has been in the Prouting family since 1945, and they love to share their piece of paradise with others. You can hunt, fish, or simply go tramping to take in the stunning vistas. This will be accompanied by a tour of their working station and a delicious lunch.

<u>Alps to Ocean Tours</u> can collect you for a 4x4 drive back into Geraldine, taking in the delights of Peel Forest before delivering you at <u>Ngā Whare Mānatu</u> for the night.



#### Day 2

Geraldine has two magnificent golf courses, so starting the day with a round of golf accompanied by a golf pro is a relaxing way to take in the majestic Four Peaks ranges and breathe in the fresh southern air.

A late lunch and tasting table at the <u>Barker's Food Store and Eatery</u>, indulging in local fare, award-winning pickles and chutneys, plus a hamper basket to take home to share with the family rounds the trip off.

## 1 Day Pre / Post Itinerary

Delegates can choose between these two unique activities or do both!

Arrange a guided tour of the Te Ana Māori Rock Art Centre by local Ngāi Tahu guides or take the opportunity to take a visit a protected rock art site a short drive from Timaru, where you will learn the history of those specific drawings and the movement of ancient Māori through the region. These tours offer personalised, authentic Māori cultural experiences. At the rock art centre, delegates can relish the incredible interactive display and involve themselves in the petrifying attack of Pouākai, the world's largest eagle, which wandered the skies more than 500 years ago or take refuge in the 'Cave of the Taniwha' where the rock art is fashioned right before your eyes.

The site visit gives the opportunity to step back in time and explore New Zealand's first art galleries in the limestone caves with expert local Ngāi Tahu guides.

The Timaru District has the highest number of rock art sites in the country with over 400 known sites spread across the district.







The afternoon sees a visit to <u>The Raptor Experience</u>, an educational and hands-on encounter with two of New Zealand's Raptors.

Delegates will learn about the lives of native raptors, how they hunt, what they feed on, the dangers to their safety and their cultural significance.

For 60 minutes, delegates will be able to enter their world and handle the birds under the guidance of an experienced handler. This is a fantastic opportunity to get up close and personal with these magnificent birds.







## 1 Day Pre / Post Itinerary

This is unique to the Timaru District and can be optional for delegates



#### Day 1: Option one

Choose a vintage trail of the most magnificent museums in New Zealand all around Geraldine. Visit the Roger Mahan Heritage Centre, the Geraldine Vintage Car and Machinery Museum and Route 79 Museum. See an incredible collection of vehicles, which is an absolute credit to all those involved currently and in the past. Knowledgeable volunteers curated a fantastic vintage selection of cars, tractors, artillery pieces, motorbikes and wall displays.



### Day 1 : Option two

Delegates can walk, run, or bike the new <u>Central</u> <u>South Trail</u> a new track from Washdyke to Pleasant Point! It is an easy Grade 1 trail and is about 12.5km long, starting at Sir Arthur Basil Park in Washdyke or in Pleasant Point.

A great way to take in some exercise on either E-bikes or regular bikes, then enjoy refreshments from <u>Arthurs Street Kitchen</u>.

### Day 2

#### Day 2: Option one

Experience New Zealand's Hunting and Fly-fishing at it's very best with <u>Glendeer Guides</u>. Hunt unbelievable heavy antlered Red Stags, beautiful wild Brown and Rainbow trout on the fly, magnificent Bull Tahr of the alpine pastures, all encompassed with New Zealand's distinguished picturesque topography.





#### Day 2: Option two

A more tranquil destination for delegates is visiting Timaru's <u>Aigantighe Art Gallery</u>. The gallery occupies the Edwardian mansion of James and Helen Grant, who not only gave the building and surrounding gardens to the people of South Canterbury but also bequeathed their private art collection.

It is home to an extensive permanent collection of New Zealand and international art. Delegates can wander through the sculpture garden and head into the gallery to view featured works from its permanent collection or one of the feature exhibitions.

On to lunch at <u>Street Food Kitchen</u>, a relaxed restaurant in the heart of Timaru. They have an ever-changing seasonal menu offering you the best experience of local produce, with outstanding service.

The afternoon sees delegates visit The <u>South Canterbury Museum</u>, which focuses on the natural heritage and history of the South Canterbury region of New Zealand - land, life and people.

They collect specimens, artefacts, images, documents and information that are used to explore the region's heritage.

Extensive collections are housed in a purpose-built wing, catalogued and stored. These collections provide the raw materials for exhibitions, education programmes, research and other activities.

Delegates get a real insight into the Timaru district and can finish the day at <u>Hector Black's Lounge Bar</u> a stylish, quirky lounge bar created in a beautiful old heritage building in Timaru. Fabulous interiors featuring leather sofas to chill out on, taxidermied animals and antiques, the best cocktails and a mouth-watering snack menu.
