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Welcome to the Timaru District

the heart of the South Island.

The Timaru District is the ideal coastal location for a holiday, and the perfect base to take in the jaw-dropping landscapes of New Zealand's central South Island. Made up of rural farmland, rugged coast and sandy beaches, the seaside city of Timaru, and our towns Geraldine, Pleasant Point and Temuka.

Discover something different filling your days with beautiful native forest and coastal walks, stunning cycle trails, museums and art galleries, indulgent food and drink and interactive animal encounters.

Location

The Timaru District is located in the Central South Island, 2 hours drive south of Christchurch, 2.5 hours north of Dunedin and 1.5 hours from Lake Tekapo/Takapō.

The region stretches from the coastal city of Timaru, through rural farmland to Pleasant Point and Temuka, to the picturesque boutique village of Geraldine, native forest at Peel Forest, and inland to the snowy peaks of Mesoptamia.

Air New Zealand offers daily domestic flights to Timaru from Wellington, with connecting flights from most other regional centres. The scheduled flight time for Wellington to Timaru flights is 80 minutes.

Drive times from airport:

TIMARU 10 minutes TEMUKA 10 minutes PLEASANT POINT 10 minutes GERALDINE 20 minutes PEEL FOREST 30 mins MESOPOTAMIA 1 hour 30 minutes.

You can fly into Mesopotamia, all private planes and helicopters are welcome.

Walk and Bike

With over 30 walking and cycling trails dotted across the Timaru District, you are sure to find a trail to suit your needs. Whether you are looking for a leisurely stroll with the family, a hike, bike ride or even somewhere to walk the dog, we have a trail for you! Discover the crystal coastlines of Timaru city, the lush native bush of Geraldine and Peel Forest or the river banks of Temuka and Pleasant Point.

Dashing Rocks, Timaru

A favourite walk for locals given its coastal views and proximity to the CBD, you can also start with brunch in the main street, or finish with drinks on the Bay Hill overlooking beautiful Caroline Bay. The track begins from the bay and heads along the Benvenue Cliffs, past Blackett's Lighthouse and the site of historic shipwrecks.

9 Huatakerekere/Little Mount Peel, Peel Forest

Regarded as one of the best day walks in Canterbury, Little Mount Peel is a bit of an uphill slog, but the views make it all worthwhile. The track is approximately 10kms and takes approximately 7-9 hours depending on the route you take and your fitness. It's compulsary to get a photo at the top. Make sure you tag @welovetimaru in your posts.

🕘 Tuhawaiki (Jack's) Point, Timaru

The walk follows the coast to the historic Tuhawaiki (Jack's) Point lighthouse, and offers spectacular views. You can walk, run or bike and the track is also dog friendly. Keep an eye out along the way as you may be lucky enough to see a seal or even a penguin on the rocky beach below.

Big Tree Walk, Peel Forest

A great option for families, the Big Tree Walk at Peel Forest takes around 30 minutes under the shelter of beautiful native forest. Enjoy the birdsong and impressive flora along the way, before reaching the Big Tree itself, a lowland Totara over 1000 years old, measuring 3 metres wide!

Centennial Park, Timaru

On the outskirts of the Timaru city area, you'll find Centennial Park, a 65 hectare reserve offering a variety of walking and biking trails for all levels. Within the park you'll also find playgrounds for the kids, sheltered BBQ areas, a large duck pond as well as a BMX freestyle park. From the south entrance you can carry on along the Otipua Creek to Saltwater Creek walkway and out to the coast.

Timaru

The South Island's best little seaside city (in our humble opinion). In Timaru city, you can enjoy easy scenic walks, through picturesque Caroline Bay and along nearby coastal tracks, or wander through our CBD to take in the Edwardian architecture and discover the locally owned speciality boutiques. We're home to the most significant collection of ancient Māori rock art in New Zealand, and at dusk can catch a glimpse of the world's smallest penguin.







Top 5 things to do in Timaru city

Te Ana Māori Rock Art

A must do when visiting the Timaru District, Te Ana Māori Rock Art is the only guided tour to see Māori rock art in New Zealand! The guided tour takes you to a protected rock art site where you will learn the history of those specific drawings and movement of ancient Māori through the region. Pair a visit to the site with a walk through their state of the art, interactive centre in the Timaru CBD where you will learn more the history of the region for early Māori settlers as well as the rock art and the work that Ngai Tahu does in the protection and preservation of these sites.

2 The Raptor Experience

Get up close with New Zealand's raptors in a unique, hands-on experience. Learn about the lives of our native raptor birds, their ways of hunting, what they feed on, dangers to their safety and their cultural significance. For 60 minutes you will enter their world and handle the birds under the guidance of an experienced handler.

🔁 Caroline Bay

Just minutes from the CBD, Caroline Bay is a NZ Top 10 family favourite beach. Safe for swimming and watersports, you can also see Little Blue Penguins/Kororā in the evenings from October to March. Within the Caroline Bay reserve you'll find the world-famous Trevor Griffith's Rose Garden, a state of the art playground focussing on local history, as well as a bike agility and skate park. During late December and early January, the Caroline Bay Carnival operates attracting visitors from all over the country.

4 Shop the main street

Stroll along Stafford Street, in the heart of Timaru's CBD and you'll be treated to a fantastic range of shopping options from locally owned specialty boutiques, to some of the nation's most famous chain-stores. Look for department stores Ballantynes and Farmers, fashion retailers Preen, Millie Rose Boutique, Soul Surf and Skate and Mac Shaw Menswear, outdoor gear by MacPac and Kathmandu, antique and gift stores and so much more! If vintage if your style, you'll find a collection of stores featuring treasures of vintage clothing, furniture and brick n brack.

📕 Do a coastal walk

Two of the regions most popular walks start from the Timaru CBD. Head to Caroline Bay to start the popular Dashing Rocks Coastal Walk or head south past the port to join the Hector's Coastal Walk heading out to Tuhawaiki (Jack's) Point.





Geraldine

Foodie favourite, Geraldine is popular with visitors. The village of Geraldine is located on the inland scenic route from Christchurch through to Lake Tekapo/ Takapō, Mt Cook/ Aoraki and Queenstown.

Located just 40 minutes from Timaru City, Geraldine's boutique village charm will delight you. The artisan food producing hub of the district, you will find Barker's Foodstore and Eatery, Humdinger Gin and Geraldine Cheese Company to name a few, located in the town centre. Up behind town, Talbot Forest is a stunning native forest reserve with a range of popular easy walking tracks. If you're into vintage machinery and vehicles, you are in the right place! Spend an afternoon exploring one of the fabulous vintage machinery museums.

Top 5 things to do in Geraldine

Cheese and chutney + plenty more

Visit the Geraldine Cheese Company and Barker's Foodstore and Eatery to sample and purchase a delicious array of locally produced fare. During the summer season, the Farmers Market is also a great place to stock up for a picnic. If gin is your thing, a visit to Humdinger Gin Distillery is a must to try their latest handcrafted botanical infused tipple!

🤈 Art for art's sake

Geraldine has long been a haven for artists and craftspeople. Stroll through the village streets to visit galleries displaying works from local and nationally acclaimed artists or take a drive to visit the artists in their studios.

Vintage adventures

Geraldine boasts 3 vintage car and machinery museums, a new military museum containing some very rare war-time exhibits, and a fabulous historical museum, telling the history of New Zealand and the area. Even if you're not a motorhead, the yesteryear displays will keep you interested for an hour or two.

Paradise on your doorstep

Explore the many walks in Geraldine, from the riverside Sculpture Trail to the meanderings of Talbot Forest. You'll be surprised how peaceful and secluded these walks feel, even when you are metres from the centre of town.

🗧 The vinyl era

Take a short 5-minute drive south of the village centre on Talbot Street and head to the Record Keeper. An independent vinyl record store where you can enjoy good coffee while listening to your favourite music. Sustainability is at the forefront of what they do. View the beautiful restoration of one of Geraldine's oldest shops which first opened in 1890.









Temuka

Vintage haven, Temuka is located just 15 minutes from Timaru City. Our town of Temuka was once known by local Māori as "The Place of the Hot Ovens", or Teumu-kaha, as they used huge earthen ovens to bake the roots of the native cabbage tree/ Tī Kōuka.

Temuka is also known world-wide for our iconic Temuka Pottery, as well as Richard Pearse who raced the Wright Brothers to be the first to fly. Shopping, eating and recreation, this small, friendly township has plenty to offer.







Top 5 things to do in Temuka

Fossick for a treasure

Whether you are after the latest fashion item, a new pair of shoes or if vintage is more your style, you will find something in Temuka. Head to Kings Shoe Store for the latest style from top brands, or His & Hers Fashion for a new outfit. Green Hayes Emporium and Temuka Treasures will have you exploring rooms full of vintage items waiting for a new home.

🤈 Hit the golf, mini golf or frisbee golf courses

Located at the domain, are golf, mini golf and frisbee golf courses. Feed your competitive side with a game with the family or friends.

Taumatakahu Stream Reserve

The Taumatakahu Stream Reserve winds its way through central Temuka. Follow the stream from the corner of Wilkin Street and Princes Street. Feed the ducks and play on the playgrounds along the way.

Discover the history of Temuka

Explore Temuka's rich heritage at the Temuka Museum in the historic courthouse. Make sure you also check out the memorial to local aviation legend, Richard Pearse who arguably bet the Wright Brother's to the first airplane flight. The monument is located at Waitohi, approximately 10 minutes from Temuka.

🧧 Visit the Temuka Pottery retail store

A favourite in New Zealand households since 1931, Temuka Pottery is a reliable hardworking national icon that has stood the test of time. The retail shop is located in Mendelson Barn - which was built in 1882 - and also houses 100% Homemade Cafe.



Pleasant Point

Enroute from Timaru City to the Mackenzie Region, from the 1800s through to today, Pleasant Point has always been a a favourite place to stop and refresh for travellers.

Locals head to Pleasant Point for riverside walks, swimming, bike rides and delicious real fruit ice creams. The Pleasant Point Museum and Railway has attractions that draw visitors from all over the world.







Top 5 things to do in Pleasant Point

Pleasant Point Museum and Railway

This is a must visit if you're in Timaru District. It's been rated as one of New Zealand's best preservation railways, but there's loads more to this attraction than that. They run fully operational steam locomotives - including the 1922 locomotive Ab699 - and a rare replica of a Model T Ford Railcar. There are museum exhibits at each end of the 2.4km long railway line that was part of the original Timaru to Fairlie railway line which was decommissioned in 1968. Rides on the steam train or the railcar are a favourite with kids and adults alike, as are the classic cartoon movies and museum exhibits.

Grab lunch at the historic Pleasant Point Hotel

Originally opened in 1864 as an accommodation house for waggoners travelling from Timaru to Fairlie, The Pleasant Point Hotel is the hub of the small rural community. Today the hotel runs as a restaurant and bar providing your favourite pub classics. A great place for a chat and a beer with the locals.

Real fruit icecreams at Strawberry Divine

People drive for miles for these ice creams, and to hang out in the funky courtyard and garden. Hosts Giles and Crissie grow their own berries and stone fruit, or source fruit locally. Pick one or two fruits and see them mixed before your eyes with vanilla ice cream or frozen yogurt.

Depending on the season they are open from September to April.

Play a round of golf

Pleasant Point has a fabulous country golf course, and visitors of all ages are welcome. If you don't have clubs with you, there is a small range of clubs for hire, as well as golf carts.

Look for bats

Pleasant Point is home to colonies of native Long-Tailed Bats. They are tiny and elusive, but keep an eye out for bat roost trees. You'll recognise these by the aluminium bands tied around them to stop predators scaling the trees. If you stare hard enough up into the branches of these trees you might get lucky and catch a glimpse of these little locals.



Peel Forest

Mesopotamia

Peel Forest is an historic bush-clad settlement located 15 minutes from Geraldine. Made up of native podocarp forest, the reserve is a popular location for locals and visitors to explore. With eight walking and tramping tracks throughout the 780 hectare reserve, there is something for every level.

Make sure you head to the Green Man at Peel Forest for a scrumptious pizza or a beer after your efforts.

Top 5 things to do in Peel Forest

Explore the Forest

Peel Forest is the perfect place for a walk. Splendour under the canopy of the large native trees and enjoy the beautiful bird song. Take the kids to see the Big Tree with it's huge 3 metre diameter! Discover Emily or Acland Falls or challenge yourself to a half-day hike up Little Mount Peel/Hudtekerekere.

2 Grab some lunch at The Green Man

Stop in at The Green Man for lunch after enjoying one of the reserves walks. Inside you'll find a delicious menu to tempt your tastebuds and grand entertainment. They also regularly host musicians and events.

3 Visit the Church of the Holy Innocents

Opened on 12 December 1869, the Church of the Holy Innocents was gifted to the community by John Barton Acland on his property of Peel Forest Station. The church is named after four infant children that are buried in cemetary, two of which are Acland's. Explore this beautiful church and cemetery.

Fishing the mighty Rangitata River

The Rangitata River is worldrenowned for salmon fishing. Bring the fishing rod and trying your luck.







5 Pack the tent and camp at the campground

This family-friendly campground is open from mid-October till the end of April each year. Wake up to beautiful birdsong coming from the forest above the camp and then tackle a day of fun outdoor activities. Mesopotamia means 'the land between the two rivers'. It's an area of outstanding natural beauty, fascinating pioneering history and outdoor adventures.



Getting there

If you have a vehicle, Mesopotamia is the perfect place for a day trip. Mesopotamia Station (the end of the road) is located a 2 hour and 45 minute drive from Timaru city, or 2 hours, 15 minutes from Geraldine.

Pack a picnic and the family, and head up into the valley watching the landscape change from seaside, to native bush and farmland to tussock covered subalpine beauty.

Sit back and relax with Alps 2 Ocean

If you are after a guided experience, look no further than Alps 2 Ocean 4x4 Tours. Explore the history of the high-country stations that farm this land. Learn about the pioneering ways of the early settlers to this region, visit the historic Mesopotamia school and graveyard as well as the peaceful Peel Forest church.



Mesopotamia Station

Located at the head of the valley, Mesopotamia Station is a fascinating place to visit.

Named in 1860 by Samuel Butler who was an explorer, pastoralist, writer, artist and musician, arriving from England in early 1860. Butler settled in this area running his sheep and building a hut up Forest Creek. The original site is marked today by a plaque. Over the coming years, Butler would expand his operations, acquiring neighbouring runs and establishing the station in it's current location.

This area became a community to those living in this remote valley, offering a school which the school building is open to the public and a great place to stop for a picnic.

Another important historic site is the cemetery which features a number of resting places from people associated with the station over the years. This includes the grave of Dr Sinclair who drowned in the Rangitata River on March 1861 when his horse bolted crossing the river. Dr Sinclair was surveying the area at the time of his death.

New Zealand's longest walking trail, the Te Araroa makes it's way through the Mesopotamia area before continuing through to Lake Tekapo

Mackenzie Region

Only 1.5hrs inland from Timaru City, and Ihr from Geraldine you'll find the glorious Mackenzie Region.

Discover New Zealand's highest mountains, longest glaciers, vivid turquoise lakes, golden grasslands and the country's largest dark sky reserve – you'll find these all in the Legendary Mackenzie!

The Mackenzie Region is an intermontane basin – an elevated plateau ringed by mountains in every direction with a tri-colour palette: turquoise lakes, white snow-capped mountains and golden grasslands. With such dramatic landscapes below and the pristine dark sky reserve above, the Mackenzie is a paradise for connecting with nature.

Top 5 things to do in Mackenzie

Highest mountain

Visit Aoraki/Mount Cook National Park, home to NZ's highest mountain! Choose from plenty of walking trails to suit all abilities or enjoy a scenic flight amongst the mountains.

🤈 Largest glacier

Explore NZ's largest glacier, the Haupapa/Tasman Glacier. Heli-hike, boat tours amongst icebergs, skiing on the glacier – there are so many ways to experience it!

🔁 Largest Dark Sky Reserve

Stargaze in a protected 4,367sq km dark sky reserve. There are many options for a stargazing experience in the Mackenzie, including a working observatory, soaking in hot pools, wine cellar, farm tours, and many more!

📶 Ski the Mackenzie Three

Take in the stunning surroundings and skip the lift queues. The Mackenzie boasts three quintessentially Kivi ski fields all within driving distance of each other. Spectacular scenery, spacious runs and laid back, family-friendly vibes create the ultimate snow holiday.

🔼 Longest cycle trail

Cycle some of NZ's longest cycle trail, the epic 315km Alps 2 Ocean. Suitable for all ages, the nine-section bike trail is an easy to intermediate grade and takes around 4 – 6 days for the entire ride. Sections can easily be ridden as a day trip as well.
